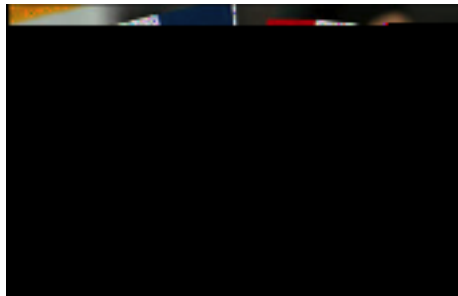
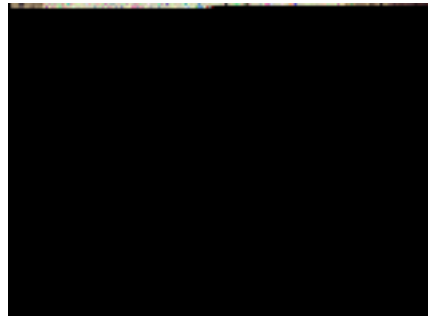

Beginning with a detailed analysis of the French Revolution as foundational for the making of modern France, this course concentrates thereafter on pivotal developments including modern colonialism in Africa, the rise of consumerism and urban spectacle, the fin de siècle crisis of bourgeois values, the interplay of so-called elite and mass cultures, and the collapse and recovery of democratic and republican institutions in the twentieth century. We highlight the othering by class, gender, and race that are central to the development of modern France and focus upon the power and limitations of culture and ideas for shaping the French nation.

This course is based in large part on discussion as the most effective format for inquiry based learning. Although occasional lectures

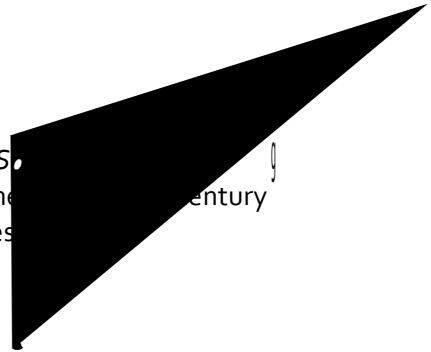
